






STATE APP STORE BILLS ARE ANYTHING BUT CONSERVATIVE

The legislation being pushed multibillion-dollar corporations like Spotify and Epic Games is:

Big Government interfering with private contracts to pick winners and losers in the market.

-  This is crony capitalism using state power to interfere with private contracts and explicitly favor one party by enacting paternalistic price controls.
-  Not surprisingly, this heavy-handed, big-government approach is supported by prominent progressives like Sen. Elizabeth Warren.

Choosing “winners” that are massive corporations seeking a public handout.

-  Corporations pushing the bill are billion-dollar:
 - Stockholm-based Spotify—the largest global music streaming service;
 - Match Group—owner of the largest online dating services;
 - Chinese-financed Epic Games—one of the largest video game corporations.
-  Smaller developers lose out as trust in the app stores is diminished.
-  Imposes restrictions on some businesses while carving out others like Microsoft's Xbox.

In violation of the United States Constitution

-  Violates the Dormant Commerce Clause and the Contracts Clause of the US Constitution.
